BIAV Submission to Fisheries (Mako Shark) Notice Statutory Consultation Plan

BIAV welcomes the opportunity to comment on the proposed Fisheries Notice to introduce a minimum size limit for make shark species.

Recreational fishing in Victoria for Shortfin Mako (Isurus oxyrinchus) is an important driver of growth in the recreational boating industry, particularly in the game fishing trailer boat and chandlery sectors.

While noting obligations on the recreational fishing community, industry and government to deliver sustainable management outcomes for HMS, a review of available evidenceⁱ has not provided BIAV the ability to support the proposal via any concerns with current management arrangements.

Therefore, the BIAV do not support the proposed fishery notice.

Whilst pleased with the consultation process and impressed by the efforts of a 12-year-old proponent to stimulate the discussion and drive the Notice, BIAV remains of the view that current arrangements and management are appropriate.
