Fish Habitat Improvement Fund



What is the Fund?

In 2022, the Victorian Government committed \$2.5 million to a Fish Habitat Improvement Fund to improve our fantastic fisheries as part of its \$96m Go Fishing and Boating Plan. This is a great opportunity for recreational fishers and waterway managers to work together, improve local fisheries, help the recovery of threatened species and leave a wonderful legacy for the next generation.

Here are the amazing projects already funded right across Victoria.

Stream 1 Empowering recreational fishers to improve local fish habitat (community led projects up to \$50,000)



Case Studies

Australian Trout Foundation

Stream 1 Project: Mayfly Rise 2.0

This project has delivered in-stream and riparian habitat to the Ovens River near Bright. Over 25 boulders have been placed alongside numerous hardwood logs, weed control, revegetation and measures to prevent vehicle damage to the riverbed.

Did you know?

The Ovens River is recovering from extensive historic gold mining that destroyed much of the original river between Harrietville and Myrtleford. Mining activity continued right up until the 1950's. Projects such as this are critical to the ongoing restoration of the river's fish population.

Stream 2 Project: Kicking Goals for Kayakers' Reef

Building on similar projects in Port Phillip, this project will provide huge benefits to fish populations in Hobsons Bay. Once colonised with shellfish and other species, restored reefs become healthy habitats, complex structures with thriving biodiversity

Did you know?

"Oyster Towers" are prefabricated structures that have been "seeded" with native oysters. Combined with recycled shell deployed by rec fisher volunteers, the project will create a complex hybrid reef, restoring the area for generations to come.
