I am a young (juvenile) trout.



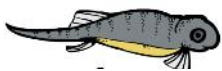
I am a big fish. I live at Snobs Creek with other male and female trout. We make eggs and sperm, which are put together in the Hatchery to produce trout eggs.

I have hatched. I carry my own lunch box (yolk sac) under my body. This contains all my food.
