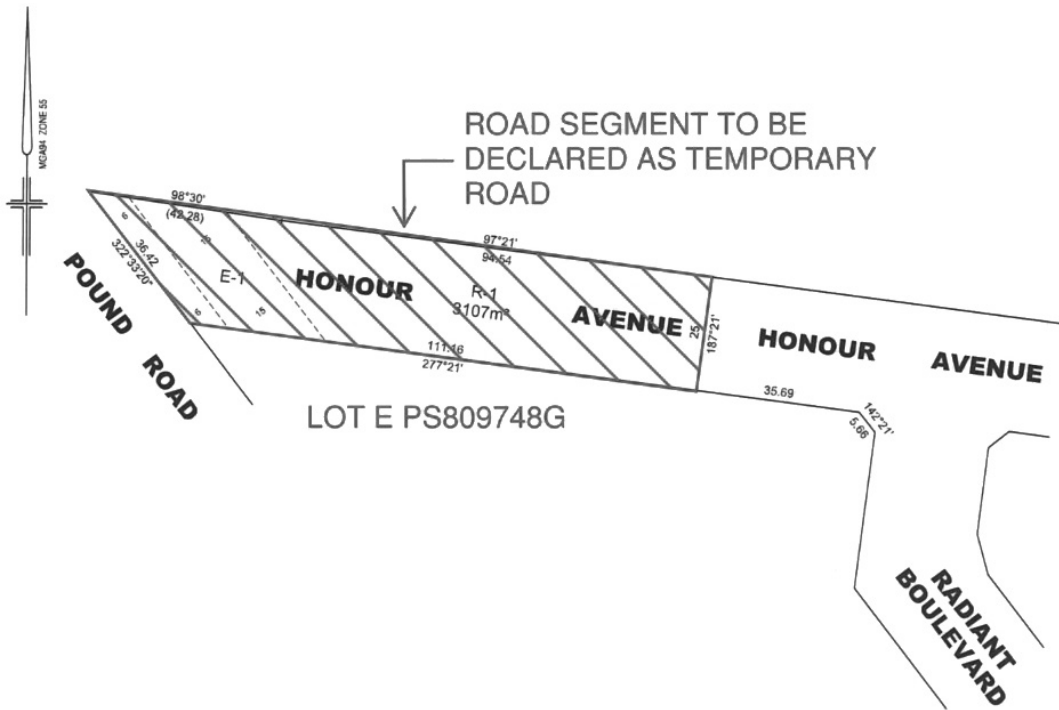

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 26(2) OF THE **DOMESTIC ANIMALS ACT 1994**

Notice is hereby given that at its meeting held on 3 December 2024, the Mornington Peninsula Shire Council resolved to make the following Order pursuant to section 26(2) of the **Domestic Animals Act 1994**:

1. **Revocation**

All previous Orders made by Council under section 26 of the **Domestic Animals Act 1994** are revoked.

2. **Dogs must be under effective control**

The Owner of any dog must keep the dog under effective control by means of a chain, cord or leash held by the Owner and attached to the dog while the dog is in a Public Place, except where that Public Place is a Designated Area.

3. **Prohibited Areas**

- (1) A dog must not enter or remain in any Prohibited Area.
- (2) The prohibition under sub-clause (1) applies in a Prohibited Area regardless of whether the dog is on a chain, cord or leash or otherwise controlled or not controlled.

4. **Owner's obligations in a Designated Area**

- (1) A dog may be exercised off a chain, cord or leash in a Designated Area, if the Owner:
 - i. carries a chain, cord or leash sufficient to bring the dog under control by placing the dog on said chain, cord or leash if the dog behaves in a manner which threatens any person or animal; and
 - ii. remains in effective voice and/or hand control of the dog and is within constant sight of the dog so as to be able to promptly bring the dog under control by placing the dog on a chain, cord or leash if it becomes necessary or desirable to avoid any wandering out of effective control or to avoid any threatening behaviour or any attack; and
 - iii. does not allow the dog to threaten any person or animal, and/or does not allow the dog to attack any person or animal.
- (2) Notwithstanding anything else in this Order, an Owner of a dog must keep the dog under effective control by means of a chain, cord or leash held by the Owner if the dog is within 20 metres of:
 - i. an area where an organised sporting event is taking place, or any practice for an organised sporting event
 - ii. a children's play equipment area
 - iii. an area where a public meeting is being held
 - iv. a permanently designated barbeque or picnic area.

5. **Non-application to specified dogs or greyhounds**

Clause 4 of this Order does not apply to any dog which has been declared a dangerous dog, a menacing dog, or a restricted breed dog under the **Domestic Animals Act 1994**, or to a greyhound which must meet the restraint requirements under section 27 of that Act.

6. Meaning of Words

In this Order:

- Daylight Savings** means the period commencing in any year on a day and time fixed by proclamation of the Governor in Council of Victoria, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette, when standard time shall advance by one hour. This period ends in the following year on a day and time fixed in the proclamation.
- Designated Area** means an area (including an area on or between specified times and/or between specified dates) described as such in the Schedule, in which a dog may be exercised in the manner set out in clause 4 of this Order.
- Owner** has the same meaning as in the **Domestic Animals Act 1994**.

Overview

The Amendment implements the remaining provisions from the Township Approaches Planning Controls and Guidelines Study, Mansfield, June 2018 (Mansfield Design Guidelines), which were not included in Part 1 of Amendment C48mans. The areas affected by this Amendment are the four (4) approaches to the Mansfield Township, which include: Maroondah Highway, Midland Highway, Mansfield-Whitfield Road, and Mt Buller Road.

The Amendment is required to integrate the Mansfield Design Guidelines into the Mansfield Planning Scheme, to guide the appearance of development along Mansfield Township’s main approaches in a manner consistent with the character identified for each individual approach. Overview

This Amendment translates the adopted *Maffra Structure Plan* (Mesh 2022) into the Wellington Planning Scheme. It provides direction for potential future residential growth

areas, commercial and industrial development through updated planning policy. The Amendment supports the long-term growth of Maffra and acknowledges its role as the second largest township within the Wellington Shire.

Details of the Amendment

The Wellington Shire Council planning authority has prepared Amendment C120well to the Wellington Planning Scheme.

FISHERIES (INSHORE TRAWL BYCATCH MANAGEMENT) NOTICE 2024**1. Title**

This Notice may be cited as the Fisheries (Inshore Trawl Bycatch Management) Notice 2024.

2. Objectives

The objectives of this Notice are to –

- (a) give further effect to the arrangement in force between the Commonwealth and Victoria in relation to the trawl fishery to be managed under State law in waters relevant to Victoria (Offshore Constitutional Settlement); and
- (b) fix and enforce limits on the taking of octopus as a bycatch species for the Trawl (Inshore) Fishery.

3. Authorising provisions

This Notice is made under sections 67 and 152 of the Act.

4. Commencement

This Notice comes into operation on the date it is published in the Government Gazette.

5. Definitions

In this Fisheries Notice –

aggregated amount means the total amount of octopus taken across all Trawl (Inshore) Fishery Access Licences over the 12 month period from the commencement of this notice;

bycatch means all species of fish other than –

- i) bay bug;
- ii) eastern king prawn;
- iii) sand crab; or
- iv) school prawn;

CEO means the Chief Executive Officer of the VFA;

closed season with respect to octopus is the period between the time a determination under clause 8 comes into effect and the time it is revoked;

fishing trip has the same meaning as in the Fisheries Regulations 2019;

licence operator has the same meaning as in the Fisheries Regulations 2019;

octopus means pale octopus (*Octopus pallidus*), Maori octopus (*Macroctopus maorum*) and gloomy octopus (*Octopus tetricus*);

place of landing has the same meaning as in the Fisheries Regulations 2019;

the Act means the **Fisheries Act 1995**;

upper limit means 30 tonnes of octopus;

VFA means the Victorian Fisheries Authority.

6. Catch and possession limit for octopus

- (1) For the purposes of the Act, the catch limit with respect to –
- (a) the taking of octopus on any day or fishing trip; or
 - (b) the possession of octopus on board any boat –
- under a Trawl (Inshore) Fishery Access Licence by the holder of the licence, or any person acting or purporting to act under the licence, is 100 kilograms.

Note: There are offences in sections 68A and 68B of the Act relating to taking or possessing fish in excess of the catch limit in this fisheries notice. Various penalties apply.

- (2) For the purposes of section 67 of the Act, the landing on any one day of more than 100 kilograms of octopus taken under a Trawl (Inshore) Fishery Access Licence, by the holder of the licence, or any person acting or purporting to act under the licence, is prohibited.

Note: A failure to comply with a prohibition is an offence under section 67(3) of the Act. A penalty of 100 penalty units or six months imprisonment or both applies.

- (3) The holder of a Trawl (Inshore) Fishery Access Licence or any person acting or purporting to act under the licence must not take, possess or land octopus under the licence on any fishing trip the person undertakes under an Octopus Fishery Access Licence or General Permit authorising the taking of octopus.

Penalty: 50 penalty units

7. Weighing of octopus taken and notification of post-fishing details

- (1) The holder of a Trawl (Inshore) Fishery Access Licence and the licence operator of the licence must ensure that all octopus taken under the licence is weighed no later than 60 minutes after the boat arrives at a place of landing.

Penalty: 50 penalty units

- (2) The holder of a Trawl (Inshore) Fishery Access Licence or the licence operator, must, no later than 60 minutes after the boat arrives at a place of landing and before the octopus leave that place of landing, provide the following details to the VFA via the fisheries notification service in relation to octopus taken under the licence –

- (a) the licence number of the access licence;
- (b) the estimated time at which the octopus are to be moved from the place of landing;
- (c) the total net weight (in kilograms) of octopus taken under the licence.

Penalty: 50 penalty units

- (3) Until the holder of a Trawl (Inshore) Fishery Access Licence, or the licence operator, has complied with sub-clause (1) and (2) in respect of octopus taken under the licence, they must not allow that octopus to –

- (a) enter any vehicle that already contains octopus; or
- (b) be sold, consigned or given to another person; or
- (c) enter any premises on which octopus is processed or held.

Penalty: 50 penalty units

8. Determination that upper limit reached

- (1) The CEO may determine that the upper limit for the aggregated amount of octopus taken by Trawl (Inshore) Fishery Access Licence holders is met or exceeded.

- (2) Without limiting the generality of sub-clause (1), a determination may:

- (a) specify that it comes into effect on a particular date and time; and
- (b) be varied or revoked at any time.

- (3) The CEO must ensure that a copy of the determination is sent to each Trawl (Inshore) Fishery Access Licence holder as soon as possible after it is made.

9. Closed season

- (1) For the purposes of section 67 of the Act –
- (a) the taking of octopus; or
 - (b) the possession of octopus in or on Victorian waters; or
 - (c) the landing of octopus –

during the closed season under a Trawl (Inshore) Fishery Access Licence by the holder of the licence, or a person acting or purporting to act under the licence, is prohibited.

Note: Failure to comply with this prohibition is an offence under section 67 of the **Fisheries Act 1995**. A maximum penalty of 100 penalty units and/or six months imprisonment applies.

10. Application to fisheries reserves

This Notice applies to a Fisheries Reserve, as declared under section 88 of the Act, to the extent that fishing is permitted in the Fisheries Reserve.

11. Revocation

Unless sooner revoked, this Notice is revoked on the day which is 12 months after the date on which it comes into operation.

Notes:

This Notice applies to the fishery which is subject to Victorian law pursuant to the Offshore Constitutional Settlement arrangements made under section 72 of the **Fisheries Management Act 1991** (Cth).

Under section 152(3) of the Act, if a provision of this Notice is inconsistent with any regulations, the Fisheries Notice prevails to the extent of the inconsistency. The general size limits and catch limits specified in the Fisheries Regulations 2009 will continue to apply in circumstances where the size and catch limits specified in this Notice do not apply.

This Notice may be cited as the Fisheries (Further Eastern Abalone Zone No. 3) Notice 2024.

2. Objectives

The objectives of this Notice are to:

- a. fix minimum size limits for blacklip abalone taken under an Abalone Fishery Access Licence in the Eastern Abalone Zone;
- b. address sustainability concerns for Victorian Eastern Abalone Zone abalone stocks and related management issues by closing specified marine waters to commercial abalone harvest.

3. Authorising provision

This Notice is made under sections 67, 68A, 114 and 152 of the Act.

4. Commencement

This Notice comes into operation on 12 December 2024.

5. Definitions

In this Fisheries Notice –

‘**AFAL**’ means an Abalone Fishery (Eastern Zone) Access Licence;

‘**CEO**’ means the Chief Executive Officer of the VFA;

‘**closed waters**’ means the marine waters within a spatial management unit for which the upper limit has been reached or exceeded as specified in Column 3 of Schedule 2 and/or the marine waters within a reef code for which the upper limit has been reached or exceeded as specified in Column 3 of Schedule 3;

‘**eastern abalone zone**’ means all Victorian waters east of longitude 148° East;

‘**nominated operator**’ means –

- (a) a licence holder permitted under section 39(1) of the Act; or
- (b) a person listed on an access licence for the purposes of section 39(2) of the Act;

‘**size zone**’ means each area of Victorian marine waters between the coordinates specified in Column 1 of Schedule 1;

‘**spatial management unit**’ means each area of Victorian marine waters specified in Column 1 of Schedule 2;

‘**reef code**’ means each area of Victorian marine waters specified in Column 1 of Schedule 3;

‘**the Act**’ means the **Fisheries Act 1995**;

‘**upper limit**’ for the spatial management unit specified in Column 1 of Schedule 2 means the amount of abalone specified in Column 3 of Schedule 2 corresponding to that spatial management unit and for the reef code specified in Column 1 of Schedule 3 means the amount of abalone specified in Column 3 of Schedule 3 corresponding to that reef code;

‘**VFA**’ means the Victorian Fisheries Authority.

6. Minimum sizes for blacklip abalone taken from the eastern abalone zone

For the purposes of the Act, the minimum size with respect to the taking of blacklip abalone under an AFAL from the waters specified in Column 1 of Schedule 1 is the size specified for those waters in Column 2 of Schedule 1.

Notes: There are offences in sections 68A and 68B of the Act relating to taking or possessing fish of a species that are less than the minimum size specified for that species of fish in this Notice. Various penalties apply.

Under section 152(3), of the Act, if a provision of this Notice is inconsistent with any regulations, the Fisheries Notice prevails to the extent of the inconsistency. The general size limits specified in the Fisheries Regulations 2009 will continue to apply in circumstances where the size limits specified in clauses 6 and 7 do not apply.

7. Abalone not to be taken from more than one size zone

For the purposes of section 67 of the Act –

- (a) the taking of abalone under an AFAL from more than one size zone on any fishing trip; or
 - (b) the possession of abalone taken from more than one size zone on-board any boat being used under an AFAL; or
 - (c) the landing of abalone taken under an AFAL from more than one size zone;
- is prohibited.

Note: It is an offence under section 67(3) of the **Fisheries Act 1995** to fail to comply with a prohibition.

8. Spatial management unit catch upper limit target exceeded

Marine waters within a spatial management unit are immediately closed (‘closed waters’) to commercial abalone harvest when the upper limit specified in Column 3 of Schedule 2 has been reached or exceeded.

9. Reef code upper limit catch exceeded

Marine waters within a reef code are immediately closed ('closed waters') to commercial abalone harvest when the upper limit specified in Column 3 of Schedule 3 has been reached or exceeded.

10. Closed waters

- (1) For the purposes of section 67 of the Act –
 - (a) the taking of abalone from closed waters; or
 - (b) the possession of abalone in or on closed waters –by the holder of an access licence, or a person acting or purporting to act under an access licence, is prohibited.

Note: Failure to comply with this prohibition is an offence under section 67 of the **Fisheries Act 1995**. A maximum penalty of 100 penalty units and/or six months imprisonment applies.

- (2) Sub-clause (1)(b) does not apply to a person possessing abalone on-board a boat under way and travelling by the most direct route to reach a point of landing or specified open waters for the purpose of commercial abalone diving.

11. Application to fisheries reserves

This Notice applies to a Fisheries Reserve, as declared under section 88 of the Act, to the extent that fishing is permitted in the Fisheries Reserve.

12. Revocation

- (1) The Fisheries (Further Eastern Abalone Zone) Notice 2024, published in the Victoria Government Gazette No. G 35 on 29 August 2024, page 1723 is revoked.
- (2) Unless sooner revoked, this Notice will be revoked on 31 March 2025.

Transport Integration Act 2010MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN VICTORIA POLICE
AND THE CHIEF INVESTIGATOR TRANSPORT SAFETY**1 Parties**

The parties to this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) are:

- Victoria Police, of 311 Spencer Street, Docklands, Victoria 3008 (Victoria Police);
- The Chief Investigator, Transport Safety, an independent statutory office under section 179 of the **Transport Integration Act 2010** (Vic.), of 1 Spring Street, Melbourne, Victoria 3000 (Chief Investigator).

2 Definitions

ATSB is the Australian Transport Safety Bureau (Commonwealth) established by section 12 of the **Transport Safety Investigation Act 2003** (Cth).

Chief Commissioner (ATSB) means the Chief Commissioner of the ATSB as provided for in section 12A of the **Transport Safety Investigation Act 2003** (Cth).

Concurrent investigation means an incident which is the subject of parallel but separate investigations by Victoria Police and the Chief Investigator.

Incident means an occurrence, accident or a circumstance.

Law Enforcement Data has the same meaning as in the PDP Act.

Marine Safety Act means the **Marine Safety Act 2010** (Vic.).

Marine safety matter means a marine safety matter within part 1 section 3 – definitions in the **Transport Integration Act 2010** (Vic.).

Office of the Chief Investigator means the operational office supporting the statutory position of the Chief Investigator, Transport Safety.

Party means a party to this Memorandum of Understanding.

PDP Act means the **Privacy and Data Protection Act 2014** (Vic.).

Protective Data Security Standards means the protective data security standards issued under Part 4 of the PDP Act, as amended or replaced from time to time.

Public transport safety matter means a transport safety matter within part 1 section 3 definitions in the **Transport Integration Act 2010** (Vic.).

Rail transport safety matter means a rail matter within the definition of ‘transport safety matter’ in section 3 of the **Transport Safety Investigation Act 2003** (Cth).

Special Investigator means a person appointed as a special investigator under section 63E of the **Transport Safety Investigation Act 2003** (Cth).

Transport Integration Act means the **Transport Integration Act 2010** (Vic.).

Transport (Compliance and Miscellaneous) Act means the **Transport (Compliance and Miscellaneous) Act 1983** (Vic.).

Transport (Safety Schemes Compliance and Enforcement) Act means the **Transport (Safety Schemes Compliance and Enforcement) Act 2014** (Vic.).

Transport Safety Investigation Act means the **Transport Safety Investigation Act 2003** (Cth).

Transport safety matter means a **marine safety matter** or a **public transport safety matter** as defined in part 1, section 3 of the **Transport Integration Act 2010** (Vic.).

3 Purpose

3.1 The purpose of this MOU is to outline the respective roles and responsibilities of, and the relationship between Victoria Police and the Chief Investigator (together ‘the Parties’) in relation to:

- (a) transport safety matters in Victoria as defined in the Transport Integration Act; and
- (b) rail transport safety matter investigations conducted by the Chief Investigator under the provisions of the Transport Safety Investigation Act.

- 3.2 Specifically, this MOU sets out procedures and working arrangements to assist the Parties in relation to:
 - (a) coordination of concurrent investigations of transport safety matters by the Parties; and
 - (b) the sharing of information between the Parties.
- 3.3 As required by section 196 of the Transport Integration Act, this MOU is required to include matters, if any, required by the regulations.
- 3.4 Nothing within this MOU is intended to:
 - (a) create any binding rights, powers, duties, liabilities or obligations;
 - (b) waive, fetter, limit or affect the rights, powers, duties, liabilities or obligations of the Parties;
 - (c) create any commitments between the ATSB and Victoria Police; or
 - (d) affect the due and proper performance of the Parties' statutory functions or their ability to comply with all applicable statutory requirements.

4 Background

Transport Integration Act matters

- 4.1 The principal function of the Chief Investigator under the Transport Integration Act is to conduct investigations into transport safety matters and report the results of those investigations to the relevant Ministers.
- 4.2 The Transport Integration Act provides for the conduct of investigations into 'public transport safety matters' and 'marine safety matters'.
- 4.3 The Chief Investigator is authorised by section 196 of the Transport Integration Act to enter into a memorandum of understanding with a person or a body with statutory functions or powers about the performance or exercise of their respective functions or powers.
- 4.4 As required by section 196 of the Transport Integration Act this MOU will be published in the Government Gazette and on the internet.

Transport Safety Investigation Act matters

- 4.5 The Chief Investigator has entered into a Collaboration Agreement with the ATSB for the purposes of the Chief Investigator conducting rail transport safety matter investigations under the Transport Safety Investigation Act (Collaboration Agreement).
- 4.6 The Chief Investigator and the ATSB have agreed to collaborate in respect of the activities specified in the Collaboration Agreement.
- 4.7 Investigators employed by the Office of the Chief Investigator have been appointed Special Investigators and delegated powers by the Chief Commissioner to conduct investigations under the Transport Safety Investigation Act.
- 4.8 Reports of investigations conducted under the Transport Safety Investigation Act are published by the ATSB.

5 Principles

- 5.1 The Parties will have regard to the following principles in the application of this MOU:
 - (a) Victoria Police and the Chief Investigator are committed to providing a safe environment for transport and marine users in the State of Victoria.
 - (b) Victoria Police and the Chief Investigator each have the statutory discretion to conduct investigations but do so for different purposes.
- 5.2 While recognising each Party's mandate and independent role, Victoria Police and the Chief Investigator are committed to a constructive and co-operative relationship in their common pursuit of improving transport safety, enhancing the safety of public transport and marine operations in Victoria.
- 5.3 Nothing in this MOU prevents either Party from making a decision to conduct an investigation or undertaking an investigation.

6 Notification – transport safety matters

- 6.1 Victoria Police will generally receive early notification of transport safety matters including marine related Incidents and will respond, when necessary, to all transport safety matters including marine incidents and search and rescue requests on coastal and inland waters.
- 6.2 Upon formal request, Victoria Police will make available all relevant marine related Incident information to the Chief Investigator.

7 Investigations

- 7.1 In the event of an Incident occurring:
 - (a) Victoria Police and the Chief Investigator have statutory obligations to investigate incidents which are the subject of this MOU;
 - (b) Victoria Police will investigate Incidents with a view to meeting its coronial investigation obligations, to apply the law and where appropriate respond to complaints from interested parties and the public;
 - (c) the Chief Investigator may investigate Incidents either under the Transport Integration Act or the Transport Safety Investigation Act with a view to discharging the functions under the respective legislation, while noting that the decision to investigate under the Transport Safety Investigation Act rests with the ATSB; and
 - (d) Victoria Police and the Chief Investigator may seek expert and/or technical advice from each other as part of any investigation.
- 7.2 In the event of a concurrent investigation, either under the Transport Integration Act or Transport Safety Investigation Act, the Parties agree to cooperate and assist each other to the extent that is allowable by the applicable legislation. To this end, both Parties agree to:
 - (a) make contact to provide details of the investigators in charge at Victoria Police and the Chief Investigator;
 - (b) inform each other of protocols, processes, concerns or restrictions related to the site, evidence, access to information or issues related to the investigation process;
 - (c) coordinate, where possible, actions onsite to avoid duplication and to ensure that neither Party compromises the other Party's investigation;
 - (d) discuss and negotiate the collection of physical evidence, information and material, recognising that for investigations under the Transport Safety Investigation Act the Chief Investigator may have priority access to evidential material pursuant to that Act; and
 - (e) seek to gather evidence from original sources in the first instance.

8 Securing a vehicle, vessel or site and protection of evidence

- 8.1 A delegate of the Chief Investigator may, for the purpose of protecting evidence that might be relevant for investigative purposes, secure the perimeter of any site at any place or restrict access to a vehicle, vessel or site under section 16 of the Transport (Safety Schemes Compliance and Enforcement) Act.
- 8.2 A Special Investigator may issue a Protection Order under section 43 of the Transport Safety Investigation Act for the purposes of protecting evidence.
- 8.3 In order to ensure co-operation and co-ordination in relation to evidence at the site of an Incident, the Parties agree, subject to relevant legislation and/or operational priorities to:
 - (a) use their best endeavours to ensure the site, vehicle or vessel is not disturbed and any evidence is not contaminated (unless necessary to do so to evacuate injured persons or to render the site safe) until both Parties have had the opportunity to examine the evidence;

- (b) make any physical evidence available for inspection to each other and not to move, take, dismantle, change or alter any such piece of evidence without advising the other Party or until providing the other Party with a reasonable opportunity to conduct a detailed inspection; and
- (c) advise the other Party of any matters of safety concern that are identified as relevant to the other Party's investigation.

9 Information Exchange

Transport Integration Act matters

- 9.1 Any request for information by the Chief Investigator or Victoria Police will be provided to each other in writing.
- 9.2 Subject to clause 9.3, the Chief Investigator may disclose information and results of any investigations conducted if the Chief Investigator considers that the disclosure is necessary or desirable for the purposes of public transport safety or marine safety.
- 9.3 If Victoria Police considers that a disclosure by the Chief Investigator of information or the results of any investigation conducted would or may have a detrimental impact or other effect on a police investigation or criminal proceeding, it may ask the Chief Investigator to not disclose that information or those results at that time. If such a request is made, the Chief Investigator agrees to consider the request to not disclose the relevant information or report. Victoria Police acknowledges that the Chief Investigator may be required to disclose information or a report by law. Victoria Police will advise the Chief Investigator when such disclosure will no longer affect a police investigation or criminal proceeding.
- 9.4 If Victoria Police requires a report from the Chief Investigator to be included in a coronial brief, a formal request must be made to the Chief Investigator.
- 9.5 Victoria Police will provide the Chief Investigator with information from the commercial and recreational vessel registration database to assist with the investigation.
- 9.6 Victoria Police will access, use and disclose the information held in accordance with the **Privacy and Data Protection Act 2014** (Vic.) and the Protective Data Security Standards.
- 9.7 The Chief Investigator will access, use and disclose information held in accordance with the Transport (Compliance and Miscellaneous) Act, Transport (Safety Schemes Compliance and Enforcement) Act, the Code of Conduct for Victorian Public Sector Employees 2015 (issued by the Victorian Public Sector Commissioner under section 61 of the **Public Administration Act 2004**) and the Protective Data Security Standards.
- 9.8 If the Chief Investigator requires access to Law Enforcement Data it will notify Victoria Police of its requirements and, if requested, ensure that those of its investigators and other personnel who require access to that data or information execute a confidentiality undertaking in favour of Victoria Police (in a form acceptable to Victoria Police) prior to being granted access.

Transport Safety Investigation Act matters

- 9.9 Where a Special Investigator requires evidential material from Victoria Police, the Special Investigator will issue a notice pursuant to section 32 of the Transport Safety Investigation Act for that material. This will ensure that the material is protected as 'restricted information' under Division 2 of Part 6 of the Transport Safety Investigation Act. When a request for information is not directed to Victoria Police by a section 32 notice, Victoria Police may request the issue of a notice prior to the release of the requested information.
- 9.10 Any information provided by Victoria Police to a Special Investigator under clause 9.9 may only be disclosed in accordance with the Transport Safety Investigation Act.

- 9.11 Any request for information by Victoria Police to the Chief Investigator must be provided in writing setting out the nature of the information sought.
- 9.12 It is understood that information obtained or generated by the Chief Investigator in an investigation under the Transport Safety Investigation Act will be ‘restricted information’ as defined by section 3 of that Act.
- 9.13 A request under clause 9.12 that seeks ‘restricted information’ will be actioned in accordance with the Transport Safety Investigation Act and subject to applicable ATSB policies and procedures.
- 9.14 It is understood that a report of an investigation under the Transport Safety Investigation Act is inadmissible in any court proceedings other than a coronial inquiry.
- 9.15 If Victoria Police considers that publication by the ATSB of a report of an investigation conducted under the Transport Safety Investigation Act would or may have a detrimental impact or other effect on a police investigation or criminal proceeding, it may submit a written request to the Chief Investigator asking that the ATSB not publish the report at that time.
- 9.16 The Chief Investigator agrees to forward that request to the Chief Commissioner (ATSB). When a response is received from the Chief Commissioner of the ATSB the Chief Investigator will advise Victoria Police.

10 Review and Termination of MOU

- 10.1 The Parties will formally review this MOU at regular intervals not exceeding two (2) years or as agreed between the Parties.
- 10.2 Authorisation for amendment of this MOU must be signed by the Chief Commissioner of Victoria Police and the Chief Investigator, or an authorised person acting on behalf of the Chief Commissioner and the Chief Investigator.
- 10.3 Either Party may terminate this MOU by giving seven (7) days’ notice in writing to the other Party.
