We, Trinsand Fisheries Pty Ltd disagree with the suggested 100 meats to the kg "rule" before shutting the bed, we consider the practicalities of measuring the meats almost impossible.
How will you determine the bed in which the catch came from? Boats may fish in different areas during one trip?
Good fisheries management should not involve marketing, leave that to the processors and retailers. In the past weights of 100 meats per kg have been sold quite successfully. Recently the market has accepted meat weights of 100 per kg and higher. As long as the scallop bed has met all fisheries and scientific criteria regarding age, length and spawning, we believe meat weight marketing should not be decided by fisheries legislation.

Whilst the issue appears to be well intentioned, the issues above indicate to us that this exercise is one that does not fit with good fisheries management, difficult to control and should be abandoned.
